

1. Avoid fatty soaps on impregnated slate
2. "Reset" the surface occasionally
3. Deep Cleaning

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Mild neutral soap
- Akemi Steinrens

1. Avoid fatty soaps on impregnated slate

Impregnated slate has a protective layer that prevents stains of all kinds from penetrating the stone.

Using fatty or wax-based soaps will leave a greasy residue on top. This is not ideal, as dirt will easily stick to this, and over time, the surface will appear yellow and dirty.

2. "Reset" the surface occasionally

From time to time, it's a good idea to go over the surface with a deep-cleaning product to break down and remove any embedded dirt and grease stains.

For this, you can use a deep cleaner such as Steinrens — a highly concentrated, acid-free cleaning product that's also free of phosphates and lye. The surfactants are biodegradable.



3. Deep Cleaning

Dilute Steinrens in a ratio of 1:1 to 1:500 depending on the level of dirt.

Apply and let sit for 10-20 minutes.

For heavy dirt, scrub with a brush if necessary.

Wash/rinse thoroughly with water afterward.
